A bachelor's degree in Sport Science prepares students for careers in sport and fitness related settings outside the public schools. It does NOT prepare students to qualify for teacher certification.

- Admission is competitive. Completion of minimum requirements does not guarantee admission.
- Cumulative GPA of 2.75 required (including transfer hrs); 2.75 GPA also required for admission requirements.
- Minimum of 40-41 credit hours required for admission. All courses must be completed for graduation (120 hrs).
- Application deadline is February 1 and mid-September. Check www.soe.ku.edu for more information.
- The Sport Management program prepares individuals to seek management-related positions in collegiate and professional sports, companies that manufacture and sell sporting equipment, and in commercial, corporate, and private fitness facilities and companies.
