- Applicants must complete all of the prerequisite courses below prior to the start of classes. Three letters of recommendation are required in addition to the online application. Admission is competitive; applicants are not guaranteed admission. Applications are reviewed on the basis of documentation of personal and scholastic aptitude as evidence by: personal statement of interest and commitment to nursing, references, extracurricular, volunteer or community activities, personal characteristics, and nursing work experience.
- When calculating GPA, all non-vocational and non-remedial courses from all colleges and universities attended are considered. With the exception of Intermediate Algebra, remedial courses are not factored into the GPA. When a course is repeated, both the original and the new grade are factored into the GPA. With the exception of ADN courses, courses that do not transfer to KU are not factored into the GPA.
- Application Deadline: To have an application considered for admission, all parts of the application (including transcripts and references) must be submitted by the deadline appropriate for your anticipated start date. The deadline to receive application materials is October 15 for the next fall semester admission date.
- Liberal Arts Requirements: The BSN consists of 124 credit hours, 62 of which are liberal arts and sciences prerequisites and electives. The remaining 62 credits are taken in the nursing program.
- Courses with grades of “D” or “F” will not be counted towards the required 60 hours. No Pass/Fail courses will be accepted.
- Students MUST have 62 completed hours to be accepted to the Nursing program. Additional electives needed to reach 62 hours can be chosen according to the student’s particular interest or needs. Electives must be transferable to KU. A maximum of 8 non-liberal arts credits will be accepted in the 62 hours required for admission. It is the STUDENT’S RESPONSIBILITY to check for updates to all transfer information. This transfer program is provided as a service and is updated at least annually. Degree requirements at the four year colleges are subject to change by those institutions.
