**Portfolio and essay requirements:** The department of Design also requires a 10-20 image portfolio with a color inventory sheet, and 3 brief essay questions. **Deadline** for the portfolio and essays is February 1<sup>st</sup> for Fall Semester and October 1<sup>st</sup> for Spring Semester.
