137 hours and a 2.0 GPA are required to graduate with the BAE degree (an additional 21 hours and a 3.0 GPA are required to complete the student teaching year).

All entering freshmen in Visual Art are required to participate in a foundation curriculum offered through the Foundations program before enrolling in advanced art or design studio courses. Students complete Drawing I, Drawing II, Art Concepts & Practice, and Art Principles & Practice (12 hours)

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** Beginning Fall 2013 transfer students will be admitted to KU's new *Core Curriculum* automatically. There will be a short period where transfer students can **opt-out** and participate in the traditional, *Non-KU Core Curriculum* instead. Only students who are admitted for and begin classes in the Summer 2015 term or prior are eligible to opt-out of the KU Core. Students must speak with an academic advisor to discuss options and determine whether opting out of the Core is an appropriate decision.
